




Powers that may be exercised and that are binding on the Town are set forth in Section 60.10 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

Omro Rushford Fire Department Status and Membership Report February 11, 2015

We have no new worker comp claims since our last report in September. Darin Treleven's claim from April 2014 is still an active claim. Closed/settled unless appealed.

Assistant Chief Ron Carpenter coordinates the department training exercises and maintains training records; 1st Deputy Chief Bryon Litton oversees our fire inspection program and maintains inspections records. He is also in charge of the health and safety program; 2nd Deputy Chief Ed Carpenter coordinates vehicle and equipment maintenance and records; and 3rd Deputy Chief Don Schrauth is our Fire Prevention and Education officer along with maintaining our firefighters with personal protective equipment and our radio communication system.

Fire Department Captains and Lieutenants assist chief officers with their duties. Captain Tom Jackson assists the Chief, Captain Brian Henry and Lieutenant Sean Angell assist the Assistant Chief, Captain Mike Carpenter assists the 1st Deputy Chief, Captain Dustin Treleven and Lieutenant Mark Devlin assist the 2nd Deputy Chief and Captains Brian Treleven and Dave Weiss assist the 3rd deputy chief. Captain Mike Carpenter is also in charge of the CPR burns for the department.

A special thank you goes out to Greg Egan for his years of service as 3rd Deputy Chief and also to Greg Jackson for his many years of service of captain to the department.







TOWN OF OMRO PLANNING COMMISSION REPORT TO ANNUAL MEETING APRIL 2015

The period between April of 2014 and March of 2015 was full of variety. Some meetings were full with actions to be taken and yet one-fourth of the scheduled meetings were canceled because of lack of submissions.

Nine Certified Survey Maps (CSMs) were submitted. After approval fourteen parcels were turned into fourteen. This produced a very small increase in Parkland Funds. Two recent submissions were tabled until issues could be rectified.

Two of the land divisions caused a need for zoning changes. Roughly as much went into ag zoning as came out and went into residential zoning. One property went from business zoning to residential without doing a land division.

One conditional use permit was reviewed and approved.

There were two variance requests made. Both were for set-back revisions and both were granted.

What started as a simple bi-annual review of the Comprehensive Plan has become a more major update. Winnebago County is doing their required update which provided the Town with an opportunity to do some related changes in the Future Land Use Plan map and its interpretation and enforcement. The Commission would really appreciate public input prior to a projected fall adoption. Planning Commission chair, Tom Tuschl, participates on the County Steering Committee for its Comprehensive Plan review.

The Algoma Sanitary District #1 has created a park on Reighmoor Road just north of highway 21. They called it "Our Park" and it is open to use.

The Town has purchased fifteen acres of land to the East of Sandhill Farms to become a park. No announcement has been made yet as to its name or when it will be dedicated. It will be accessed from Fenceline Lane which comes off Marquardt Road. Schnyder/Wendt Park behind the garbage and recycle drop-off site continues to be open on weekends and has been the site of Eagle Scout work.

The Plan Commissioners participate on a quarterly basis in Winnebago County Plan Commissioners' Network meetings where issues common to several Towns can be discussed.

Town personnel have been involved in meetings and information sharing as the Algoma Sanitary District #1 and the City of Omro attempt to negotiate a new contract for sewer services to Town residents.

The Town Chairman will be making appointments to fill two seats on the Commission as those terms expire.

The Plan Commission meets on the Thursday which follows the first Tuesday of each month at 6:30 P.M.
