PRIMARY ELECTIONS

The partisan primary elections will be on Tuesday August 9, 2022, from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. in the Town of Omro Town Hall. In issue 7A of the *Omro Town Crier* the list of all candidates in all parties was provided. That issue can be reached through this link:

Votes cannot be cast in more than one party. If votes cross parties, none will be counted unless the voter has filled in the circle indicating a party choice. Then only votes within that party will be counted. VOTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IN PERSON

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Tuesday, July 26, 2022.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Friday, August 5, 2022.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.

In-person absentee voting may take place at the Clerk's office on
Mondays, Noon - 4 pm
Wednesdays, 9 am – Noon

Or by Special Appointment (must be scheduled 48 hours in advance)

The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on Tuesday, August 9, 2022. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

JULY 17, 2022, TOWN BOARD MEETING

Prior to the start of the meeting of the Town Board Supervisors a Public Hearing was held to discuss the addition to the Town of Algoma Sanitary District property located at 4375 Reighmoor Road.

During the meeting, the board did the following:

Approved the addition of the above-mentioned property into the Algoma Sanitary District.

Approved a zoning change from R-1 to A-2 for property located at the northern extent of Rivermoor Road as it exits the Town of Omro and into the Town of Winneconne.

Postponed action on the request to modify drainage along Michigan Ave.

Postponed action on a request to sell unused cemetery land.

Approved an intergovernmental agreement to satisfy eligibility for a recycling consolidation grant.

Renewed agreement with Strand Associates for technical services.

Tabled action on an agreement to service property tax payments on-line.

Discussed decisions that needed to be made in order to have the ordinance codification ready for public hearing. Some issues were the number of dogs that could be kept, the size of fines in ordinances where fines were specified and issues regarding sludge disposal.

Approved three operator licenses.

Approved a request from the Town Clerk to not have office hours on August 24.

A closed session was on the agenda but was not taken up.
