

About Election Inspectors

Election Inspectors are the gatekeepers of democracy and are vital to efficient, open elections. Election Inspectors (often referred to as “poll workers”) are responsible for election procedures in the polling location to which they are assigned. These procedures include, but are not limited to: helping to open the polls, registering voters, issuing ballots, providing assistance to voters, explaining the use of voting equipment, closing the polling location, and delivery of election returns.

Training & Time Commitments

Training is required and provided by the Town Clerk. This training will provide the necessary information and knowledge to be a successful Election Inspector. On Election Day, inspectors will start at approximately 6 a.m. and work until the completion of their duties after the polls close, or other hours as assigned by the Town Clerk.

Requirements

The following is required to be a Town of Omro Election Inspector:

- Be an adult citizen of the United States who resides in Winnebago County
- Be able to speak, read and write fluently the English language
- Have good clerical skills, be able to solve problems and be an effective communicator
- Work as a team
- NOT be a candidate (or family member of) for any office being voted on at the polling location during the election
